Solution: The evolution demonstrates a shift from natural light sources like fire and sunlight to artificial systems, marking a transition to greater control and sophistication. Technologies like tungsten bulbs made performances visible indoors, while LEDs allow for precise color manipulation and effects, enriching the narrative.

Solution: Floodlights offer broad illumination but lack control; PARs produce intense, oval beams with less shape control; Fresnels allow for beam modification. Their applications vary based on needs for coverage, mood, and focus in productions.

Solution: Acoustics shape sound clarity and distribution. When designed well, they eliminate the need for microphones. Bad acoustics necessitate electronic systems to ensure voices are heard clearly, retaining emotional intent.
