Solution: The four types of paintings are Satya (Realistic), Vaiṇika (Classical/Lyrical), Nāgara (Urban/Refined), and Miśhra (Mixed). Each type has distinct characteristics such as realism in Satya and blends in Miśhra. Contemporary Indian art reflects these styles through diverse forms. For example, artists may combine traditional realism with modern abstract techniques.

Solution: Visual journals serve as a record of an artist's thoughts, observations, and techniques. They promote creativity and self-reflection.
