1. Define 'medium' in the context of visual art. How does it influence an artist's work?

Artists choose mediums based on their desired outcomes, themes, and personal styles. For example, oil paint can create rich textures and deep colors, while watercolors provide a lighter, more ethereal quality. The choice of medium affects not only aesthetic aspects but also the techniques employed by the artist. For instance, the fluidity of watercolors may inspire different brushwork than the thickness of acrylics. Understanding the characteristics of various mediums allows artists to express their ideas more effectively.

4. Describe the traditional sculptural crafts of India, focusing on specific examples and their significance.

Solution: India has a rich heritage of sculptural crafts, exemplified by the crafted bamboo hats (Sumok Thyāktuk) made by the Lepchas and the intricately carved items made from the śholāpith plant. The bamboo hats are used during festivals and rituals, highlighting the cultural significance of material and craftsmanship. The making process involves weaving fine threads, often taking a month to complete a single hat. Similarly, the śholāpith tradition, primarily found in West Bengal and Odisha, showcases detailed craftsmanship that creates decorative objects and garlands, emphasizing both artistic skill and cultural practices during festivities. These crafts reflect local resources and the artists' connection to their traditions.

Solution: Paints and inks differ significantly in their composition and application. Paints, such as oils and acrylics, are thicker and primarily used for creating artworks on surfaces like canvas or paper. They provide various textures and finishes depending on the medium chosen. Inks, however, are typically thinner and used mainly for drawing, calligraphy, or printing; they can be applied with pens or brushes. Inks allow for detailed line work and can provide a smooth finish. While paint is more often used for colorful illustrations, ink can be essential for outlines and detailed work, highlighting its importance in the overall art process.
