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1. Symbolism: Define and give examples.

Symbolism uses objects, actions, or colors to represent deeper meanings beyond their literal sense.

2. Metaphors: Key literary devices.

Metaphors draw comparisons between unrelated things to express complex ideas, enriching storytelling.

14. Symbolism in dance.
