1. What is the importance of theatre as a form of cultural expression?

Solution: Theatre is vital as it serves as a cultural mirror reflecting societal values. It fosters empathy as audiences explore various human experiences. Solution: Rasa refers to the emotional flavors conveyed in performance that evoke specific feelings in the audience. There are nine primary Rasas: Śrīṅgāra (love), vīra (heroism), karuṇa (compassion), raudra (anger), bhayānaka (fear), bībhatsa (disgust), hāsyā (laughter), adbhuta (wonder), and Śhānta (peace). Each Rasa plays a critical role in storytelling by enhancing the audience's emotional engagement. For instance, a scene that portrays fear may use suspenseful music and lighting to amplify the rasa of bhayānaka. Understanding Rasa helps actors portray emotions effectively while creating a connection with the audience. It also emphasizes the importance of emotional authenticity in performance.

Solution: Improvisation allows actors to explore spontaneity and creativity in their performances. It helps develop quick thinking and adaptability, crucial for live performances.
