Challenge Questions

1. Evaluate the role of community participation in maintaining public hygiene and health, with reference to the example of Mawlynnong Village.

Solution: Social distancing is essential to prevent the spread of COVID-19 by reducing physical contact. However, it can lead to psychological effects such as stress, loneliness, and anxiety due to isolation and fear of the disease. Examples include the stigma faced by individuals with symptoms. Counterpoints might highlight the necessity of balancing public health measures with mental health support.

4. Compare and contrast the features of healthy community living in a village, a modern township, and an urban slum.

Hint: Focus on the accessibility of resources and community involvement in each setting.

Solution: A village like Mawlynnong emphasizes cleanliness and collective effort, a modern township offers planned amenities and safety, while urban slums lack basic facilities and face overcrowding. Each setting has unique challenges and strengths, such as the village's community spirit versus the township's infrastructure. Counterpoints might discuss the economic disparities that influence these living conditions.

5. Evaluate the effectiveness of the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan in promoting healthy community living.

Hint: Consider the campaign's objectives versus its real-world impact.

Counterpoints might address the accessibility and affordability of such activities for all students.

7. Discuss the role of local government and panchayats in ensuring basic amenities for healthy community living.

Hint: Consider the intersection of policy and community action.

Solution: Local governments and panchayats are responsible for providing clean water, sanitation, and healthcare facilities. They enforce regulations and promote waste management practices. Examples include the role of panchayats in Mawlynnong Village. Counterpoints might highlight the need for greater accountability and community involvement in governance.

10. Reflect on the statement 'High income alone is not the only criterion for healthy living' with reference to the chapter.
